Two trainers visited Sierra Leone in July, 2022 and Organized a 2 days training course in Freetown. Out of the 6 participants, 5 of them attended.	There has been a follow-up program in the form of online courses, examinations and training undertaken by the DCOs. Two of them attended the training here in Uganda.
